I am requesting funding to facilitate right-of-way, engineering and environmental documentation for the US 169/TH 282/ CH 9 Interchange Project.

The lead project sponsor for this project is Scott County, and the project is located at the intersection of US 169/ TH 282/ CH 9 in Jordan, MN (55352).

The funding is designated to help the County construct an interchange that will provide improved pedestrian and bike access to the residents of Jordan, a grade separation of the Union Pacific mainline rail crossing on CH 9 and improve mobility for freight and regional traffic on US 169 with reliable and safe access to US 169, for residents of Jordan and the surrounding area.

The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer dollars and aligns directly with the effort to find solutions to the multi-modal infrastructure needs in Minnesota's 2nd District. Local partners, including the US Highway 169 Corridor Coalition have identified the project as necessary to support commerce and economic growth in Scott County, between the Twin Cities and southern Minnesota.

I strongly encourage your inclusion of this project in upcoming federal surface transportation reauthorization legislation.
